Derek's completion of the 3 phase program resulted in him experiencing a positive change in his life. Derek continues to work hard and well with his sponsor. He didn't have any relapses during his stay. He has built a solid foundation for recovery and is committed to the daily application of new coping and problem solving skills. We have high hopes for his future!

Rise and shine starts at 6:30am! The day begins with devotions led by volunteers. The rest of the day differs for each participant. Some leave for work, others head out to find work, and others attend Milestone to receive an array of services designed to assist them in developing strategies for self-improvement and change necessary for positive outcomes in their lives and our community. The various programs participants attend include: Mountain Movers, a 105-day recovery program, and Narcotics/Alcohol Anonymous groups. Participants must be back in the house by 11pm with lights out at 1am. Repeat.
